Introducing the Critical Incident Support Team! This team was approved by county Legislature in the best interest of the Niagara County first response community and their members. The purpose of this team is to provide crucial support and resources during the aftermath of critical incident response in efforts to mitigate the psychological and emotional strain that impact our firefighters and EMS providers.

We are excited to officially introduce the compassionate and dedicated individuals behind our Critical Incident Support Team. We applaud their commitment, judge-free empathy and encouragement to our firefighters and EMS providers. The members of this team have undergone training in *Assisting Individuals in Crisis & Group Crisis Intervention*, provided by the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation. They have also been certified in *HIPAA for First Responders* through Fire Rescue One Academy. This specialized training provides the readiness to offer confidential peer support in time of need.

The team has already facilitated four debriefings this year. Among those attended, we have had many kind words of thanks and motivation to continue our efforts in this much needed program. Many have validated that what we’re doing is helpful and it works.

Breaking the stigma that has been instilled for so long. Talking helps. Don’t bury your emotions. Our team is providing comfort while being surrounded by familiar faces. Together, our goal is to build a culture of care, resiliency, and connection – one conversation at a time.

Now that winter is here, below are some tips to keep your family and home safe!

- Make sure you clear all snow and ice from around your furnace, water heater, and generator vents
- Keep flammable items 3 feet from heating sources (furnaces, fire places, space heaters)
- If you use a fireplace, make sure you have your chimney professionally cleaned and inspected yearly
- Make sure your smoke detectors and CO detectors are working properly
- And only use generators and grills outside, with the exhaust pointed away from the home





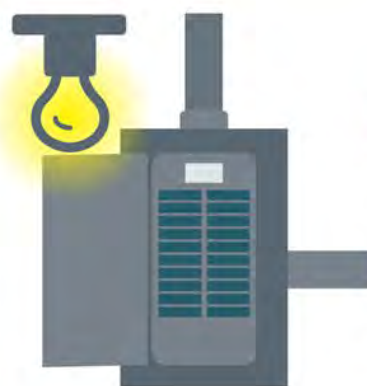


# Be fire smart

with electricity in your home.

There are approximately **45,000** home electrical fires each year.



**Half** of all home electrical fires involve lighting equipment or home electrical wiring.



Home electrical fire deaths peak between **midnight and 8 a.m.**



Peak months for electrical fire deaths are **November through March.**

Plug only 1 heat-producing appliance (like a coffee maker, space heater or microwave) directly into a wall outlet at a time.



Never use an extension cord with a heat-producing appliance.



Extension cords should only be used temporarily. Have an electrician install additional wall outlets where you need them.



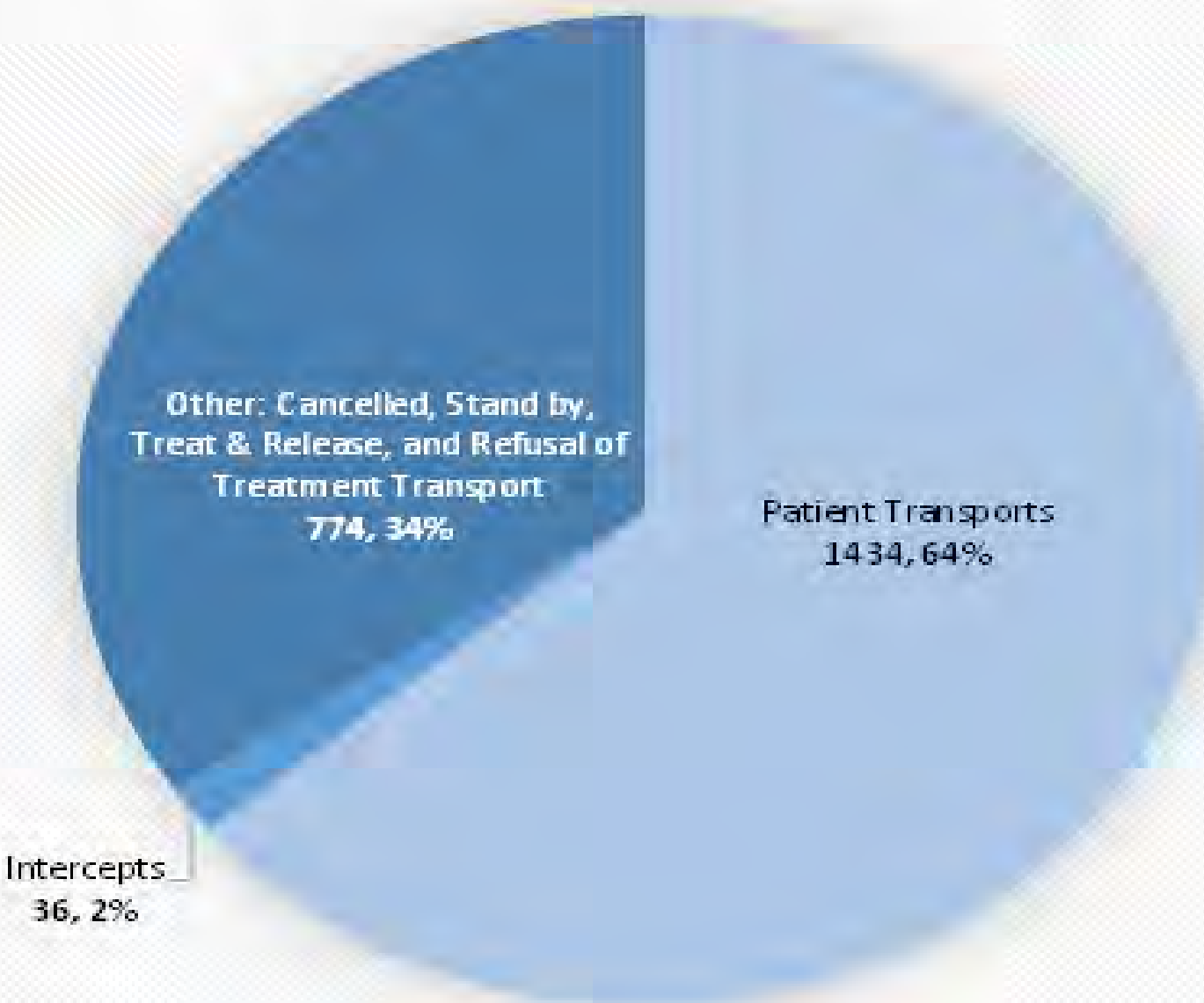

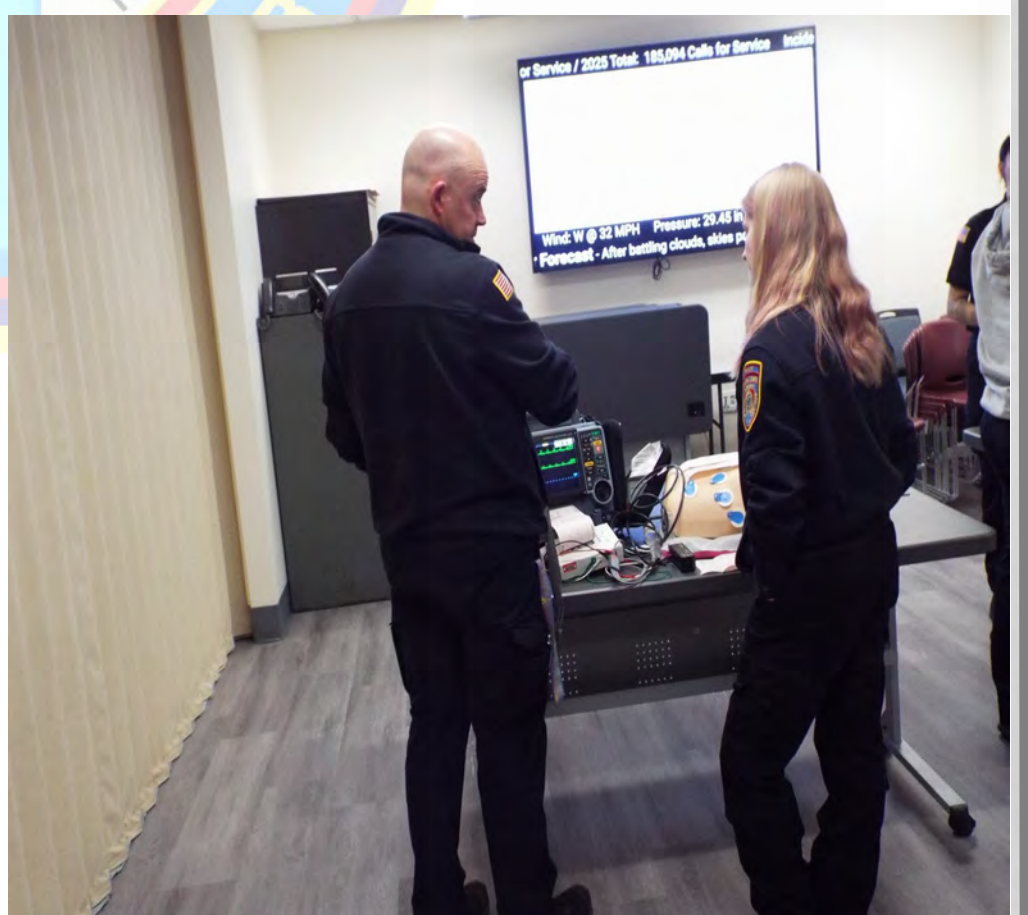
