# POSITION APPOINTMENT COMMISSIONER OF NIAGARA COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, under the Local Law establishing an Administration Code for the County of Niagara, the County Manager shall make appointments for the position of Commissioner of Economic Development subject to the confirmation of the County Legislature, and

WHEREAS, Andrea Klyczek has served as Deputy Commissioner since 2018, during which time she has spearheaded initiatives such as the Façade and Production Programs, the Niagara County Microenterprise Program, and the establishment and expansion of the Niagara Orleans Regional Land Improvement Corporation (NORLIC), which has secured over \$3M in grant funding for property rehabilitation across the County, and

WHEREAS, the County Manager has reviewed annual performance evaluations of Andrea Klyczek and has determined that Ms. Klyczek exceeds performance requirements for the position, and

WHEREAS, Ms. Klyczek has concurrently held the position of Executive Director of the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency (NCIDA) since June 1, 2024, following her prior role as Assistant Director, thereby facilitating integrated economic development services through a shared position between the NCIDA and the Department of Economic Development, and

WHEREAS, the review by the NCIDA has determined Andrea Klyczek surpasses all expectations in her position as Executive Director, and

WHEREAS, the NCIDA is currently in a shared service agreement with the County, date which expires December 31, 2025, and

WHEREAS, NCIDA desires to continue to use the services of the Niagara County Commissioner of Economic Development and enter into a new Administrative Services Contract with the County, and

WHEREAS, upon review and consideration and recommendation for appointment by the County Manager, it has been determined that Andrea Klyczek best meets the qualifications for the position of Commissioner of the Niagara County Department of Economic Development, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Andrea Klyczek is hereby appointed to a five-year term as Commissioner of the Niagara County Department of Economic Development, effective October 22, 2025 through October 21, 2030, beginning at an annualized salary of \$140,000, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of the Niagara County Department of Economic Development shall be entitled to further increases in compensation, and all the benefits normally granted to Department Heads for the duration of the appointment, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the existing agreement between Niagara County and the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency shall remain in place until December 31, 2025, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the salary and benefits in the subsequent years of this appointment will be shared by the County and the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency, whereby the NCIDA will pay 50% of the then current salary along with 50% of the benefits and other costs to be billed to NCIDA monthly by Niagara County, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Attorney's Office is authorized to review and negotiate the shared services agreement with the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency, formalizing the continued collaboration and integration of economic development services between the two entities, and be it further

RESOLVED, that following the County Attorney's review, the shared service agreement between the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency and Niagara County may be executed pursuant to the Niagara County Contract Policy.

# A RESOLUTION FOR HARRIET TUBMAN UNDERGROUND RAILROAD NEW YORK SCENIC BYWAY NOMINATION AND CORRIDOR MANAGEMENT PLAN ADOPTION

WHEREAS, the historic qualities of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, as described in the corridor management plan, and the surrounding areas have been appreciated and celebrated for over a century by the residents of New York State, as well as tourists, historians, artists, authors, and other visitors to the region; and it is this unique combination of the journeys of Harriet Tubman and those Freedom Seekers who traveled on the Underground Railroad that create the special sense of place that is vital in telling the New York story of the human desire for freedom and the historic sites they utilized during their journey to emancipation, and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, composed of representatives of 22 municipalities along the proposed scenic byway route, committed to working cooperatively to protect and promote the historic, scenic, recreational, and economic well-being of the 544-mile Corridor throughout the state and agreed to pursue the nomination of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Steering Committee, each of the 22 counties contributed to the development of this corridor management plan by encouraging public participation, confirming the vision and goals, and leading individual meetings of the Collaborative, and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of the Harriet Tubinan Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, consisting of relatives of Harriet Tubinan, descendants of Freedom Seekers, Harriet Tubinan and/or Underground Railroad historians, representatives from state and federal agencies, has strengthened the historic integrity, representation, and the principles of the corridor management plan, and

WHEREAS, in the process of developing this corridor management plan, the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Steering Committee has strengthened the bonds of inter-municipal cooperation, and the involved entities envision further benefit through scenic byway designation including sustained collaborative progress, increased funding opportunities for recommendations identified in the plan, enhanced partnerships with agencies responsible for the stewardship of resources along and adjacent to the byway route, and an improved visitor experience that interprets and promotes the corridor's intrinsic qualities and resources, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County supports the designation of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway which includes programs for stewardship and enhancement of the historic scenic byway and guidance to manage future activities along its corridor, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Niagara County confirms that they will not approve any requests for new off-premise outdoor advertising signs along the designated Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway route, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Niagara County confirms that they will abide by and follow all existing New York State and Federal laws and regulations that are applicable to this resolution, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Niagara County will work in partnership with the other municipalities along the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway and local and regional stakeholders in order to support future Byway programs, economic development, marketing, and collaborate with these interested entities to explore opportunities for cooperation to realize the Scenic Byway goals.
