The lease agreement states the County has the option to hire a contractor to complete the repairs and withhold rent, however the landlord would like to amend the lease agreement to have the County hire contractors to complete the repairs and the landlord will pay the contractors directly. Katie advised against amending the current lease.

BUDGET MODIFICATION - TO COVER EMPOWER NIAGARA ALLOCATION REIMBURSEMENTS FOR REMAINDER OF 2025 BUDGET YEAR

WHEREAS, Niagara County administers the Empower Niagara Program which offers low-cost hydro power allocations to qualifying small businesses, and

WHEREAS, the low-cost hydro power allocations result in cash reimbursements to qualifying companies to assist them in paying their electric bills, and

WHEREAS, the electric commodity rates and delivery charges in 2025 have increased at a faster rate than anticipated, totally depleting the funds made available in the 2025 budget for reimbursement to Empower Niagara businesses, and

WHEREAS, the historically high pricing is expected to persist, with the upcoming winter having the potential to set new records for gas and electric pricing in New York State, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that in order to fulfill the County's obligations stemming from the agreements between the County and the ten existing Empower Niagara businesses, and per the advice of the County's energy consultant, that additional funds be placed in the Niagara County Economic Development 2025 budget, and be it further
