NCCC Karen K	 Year 2 apprenticeships have wrapped up at both Saint Gobain locations. Year 3 will begin in September. SUNY Apprenticeship funds were used for both locations> They were able to access \$5,000 per student to cover tuition. SUNY Workforce Development Training Grant ended with three businesses taking advantage of over 50 hours of very reduced cost training. NYSDOL Hazard Abatement Grant was submitted with 8 companies included for free training in 22 OSHA and Safety topics.
