RESOLUTION TO PARTICIPATE IN AND RECEIVE FUNDS FROM NYS FRONTLINE HEALTH CARE WORKER BONUS PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Governor Hochul launched the Health Care Worker Bonus Program pursuant to Part ZZ of Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Heath Care Worker Bonus Program allows qualified employers to issue bonus payments to frontline health care workers to "recruit, retain, and reward health care and mental hygiene workers" meeting specified eligibility requirements, and

WHEREAS, the bonus amounts will be commensurate with the number of hours worked by eligible workers covered by the Health Care Worker Bonus Program during the five designated vesting periods for up to a total of \$3,000 per covered worker, and

WHEREAS, the five vesting periods will be designated as vesting period 1: 10/1/21 - 3/31/22, vesting period 2: 4/1/22 - 9/30/22, vesting period 3: 10/1/22 - 3/31/23, vesting period 4: 4/1/23 - 9/30/23, vesting period 5: 10/1/23 - 3/31/24, and

WHEREAS, that qualified employees who work at least 20 hours but no more than 30 hours per week are eligible for a bonus of \$500, qualified employees who work at least 30 but no more than 35 hours per week are eligible for a bonus of \$1,000, qualified employees who work at least 35 hours per week are eligible for a bonus of \$1,500, and

WHEREAS, that qualified employees are eligible for up to two vesting periods and the maximum any qualified employee may receive is \$3,000, and

WHEREAS, the funds to pay for this initiative will be paid by the NYS Frontline Health Care Worker Bonus Program, and

WHEREAS, eligible frontline direct care health and mental hygiene care workers are designated by title within the regulation, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County is designated as a qualified employer and must provide eligible employees with an Employee Attestation Form which must completed and be returned to Niagara County administration prior to submitting claims for bonus payments, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County as a qualified employer must submit timely claims to NYS and must pay timely approved and funded bonus amounts to qualified employees based on the number of hours worked during the applicable vesting periods, and

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Department will work with the Mental Health Department and Public Health Department Administration, Management and Budget Office, County Manager's Office, and Niagara

County Treasurer's Office to coordinate bonus payments to eligible employees pursuant to the NYS Frontline Health Care Worker Bonus Program, and now, therefore, be it

MH - 2022 BUDGET MODIFICATION – ACCEPT UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE (DOJ) COMPREHENSIVE OPIOID, STIMULANT, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM'S (COSSAP) GRANT

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Department of Mental Health, as the Local Governmental Unit (LGU), is responsible for the planning and oversight of the services system to ensure the availability and continuance of services to adults with mental illness and substance use disorders who are living in Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Department of Mental Health provides services to adults with mental illness and substance use disorders who are living in Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services has been awarded Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Program's (COSSAP) Grant funding by the Office of Justice Programs at the U.S. Department of Justice, to participate in a locally driven response to the Opioid Epidemic, and

WHEREAS, serving all of Niagara, Niagara County Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, along with sub-recipient agency Save the Michaels and partners including probation, law enforcement and public health, will create Niagara County PATH-3D (Presenting Alternatives for Treatment and Healing – Deflect, Destignatize, attend to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion), a two-pronged, harm-reduction approach connecting individuals to recovery supports and treatment while diverting from criminal justice involvement; the project will use a research partner, Niagara University, and

WHEREAS, PATH-3D will continue and expand the community's Quick Response to Opioid Overdose Team (QRT) to include response to overdoses of any drug type and add Family Peer Support (CRPA-F). QRT will expand to include referral sources beyond Law Enforcement, such as other first responders, hospitals, providers, and self-referral. Dispatched to conduct follow-up with individuals post OD, the QRT will engage an individual, assess for and assist with a broad range of social, medical, and recovery support needs. Family support will be provided, including for fatal OD, and

WHEREAS, PATH-3D will also create a Probationer Response Team (PRT), embedding a Licensed Clinician and CRPA into probation to assist probationers at risk of violation or revocation due to substance related issues; the PRT will engage probationers, assess, develop individual plans, and connect participants to recovery supports, and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Program's (COSSAP) Grant funding requirements give specific staffing criteria for the project management of grant activities and also to work within the Probationer Response Team (PRT), and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Program's (COSSAP) Grant totals \$1,298,000 spread over a period of 3 years with the opportunity for ongoing and continued funding, as available, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the department is given authorization to accept the full COSSAP Grant and enter into contracts with Save the Michaels of the World (subrecipient), and Niagara University (subrecipient), and be it further

RESOLVED, that the following position: one (1) Licensed Clinician position, Grade 11, Step 1, at an hourly rate of \$28.50, be created within the Niagara County Department of Mental Health, and filled effective December 1, 2022, to carry out the required roles and responsibilities to under the guidelines and requirements of the U.S. Department of Justice Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Program's (COSSAP) Grant, position to be coterminous with funding availability for this position, and be it further

MH - 2022 BUDGET MODIFICATION – ACCEPT SAMHSA CERTIFIED COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CLINIC (CCBHC) GRANT

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services provides services to adults with mental illness and substance use disorders who are living in Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services has been awarded grant funding from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, Center for Mental Health Services, to participate in the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) program, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (NCDMH) will build upon and transform its existing trauma-informed, licensed outpatient clinic and community services to create Niagara County Comprehensive Counseling and Wellness (NCCWC), a CCBHC serving adults with Serious Mental Illness (SMI) and children/youth with Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) across Niagara. Individuals served will have improved health, wellness, and quality of life, and

WHEREAS, the NCDMH serves individuals who are at extremely high risk, compared to our county, region and NYS on key health indicators, including 12-month rates of inpatient hospital and emergency room visits related to MH, SUD, and medical conditions. Additionally, 60% of persons served have a co-occurring MH/SUD and 30% do not have an active relationship with a Primary Care Provider (PCP), and

WHEREAS, persons served are disproportionally low income, BIPOC, LGBTQ, Veterans, and trauma victims in comparison with the local community, and are disproportionately impacted by health disparities, having less access to quality care, increased barriers due to lack of transportation, and increased fear/stigma associated with seeking help. Additionally, there is a critical shortage of services for children in our community, and

WHEREAS, this funding will allow NCDMH to increase the number of people, including children, who have access to high-quality care and who experience improved health and well-being by supporting and offsetting costs for staff who are engaging in critical services including clinical as well as medical staff (LPN, family nurse practitioner) and training all direct service staff in a range of evidence-based treatment, and

WHEREAS, the funding will allow NCDMH to implement an advanced Electronic Health Record in order to assure effective coordination of consumer care and to create an effective, sustainable CQI/program development process that will utilize data tracking, collection and analytics to assess and improve outcomes at the program, population and sub-population levels, and

WHEREAS, the SAMHSA Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) grant funding requirements give specific staffing criteria to provide direct care services, supervision, and assistance to NCDMH administration to ensure the success of CCBHC services, and to be consistent with the rules and regulations of the New York State Office of Mental Health and New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services, and

WHEREAS, the SAMHSA Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) grant totals \$3,826,453 spread over a period of 4 years and Niagara County Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services intends to convert the two positions created for this program to be fully revenue supported; in the event that this does not occur and the positions cannot support themselves through generated revenue at the end of the 4 year grant period, these positions will be coterminous with the funding, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the department is given authorization to accept the full CCBHC Grant and enter into contract with the Mental Health Association, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the following positions: One (1) Community Mental Health Aide position, Grade 8, Step 1, at an hourly rate of \$22.26 and one (1) Account Clerical I position, Grade 4, Step 1, at an hourly rate of \$18.48 be created within the Niagara County Department of Mental Health, and filled effective December 1, 2022, to carry out the required roles and responsibilities under the guidelines and requirements of the SAMHSA Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) grant, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the following 2022 budget modification be effectuated:

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER A CERTAIN AMENDMENT INCREASING WATER RATES OF THE NIAGARA COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Water District is a wholesale water producer that sells water to the twelve Towns located within Niagara County, as well as certain Villages and certain "out of district" users, which municipalities in turn sell water to retail users at prices that each determines, and

WHEREAS, the three Cities located within Niagara County each maintain their own water filtration and treatment facilities, and do not rely on the Niagara County Water District for their ordinary supply of water for retail sale within the Cities, and

WHEREAS, the Administrative Board of the Niagara County Water District has determined to establish a certain amendment to the water rates for the Niagara County Water District,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to hold a public hearing before said water rates become finally established, and

WHEREAS, said rates are subject to the approval of the Niagara County Legislature, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held by the County Legislature of the County of Niagara, with the Administrative Board of the Niagara County Water District, at the Niagara County Courthouse in the City of Lockport, New York, on the 15th day of November, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. to consider said amendment to the water rates, and that at least ten days' notice of said hearing be published in the official papers of the County of Niagara. A copy of said Notice together with the proposed amendment is as follows:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Administrative Board of the Niagara County Water District and the County Legislature of the County of Niagara will meet at the Niagara County Courthouse in the City of Lockport, New York on the 15th day of November, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. to consider a certain amendment to the water rates as proposed and recommended by the Administrative Board of the Niagara County Water District and to hear all parties interested therein concerning the same. A copy of said proposed amendment to the water rates is on file in the Office of the Niagara County Water District, 5450 Ernest Road, Lockport, New York and in the Office of the Clerk of the County Legislature, located in the Niagara County Courthouse, Lockport, New York, where the same may be examined by any interested person during regular business hours.

The proposed amendment to the Niagara County Water District Rules and Regulations establishing rates, effective January 1, 2023 is as follows:

Section XII - Water Service Classifications and Rates

Classification No. 1 – Rates are hereby established as follows:

Rates for water used by Corporations located within the District with properties subject to Water District Taxes:

Rates for water used by Corporations located outside the District and contributing to District deficits by annual payment in lieu of taxes as set forth by contract between the District and said Corporations.

Water Rate as of January 1, 2023......\$1.00/1,000 gallons

Water Rate as of January 1, 2025.....\$1.10/1,000 gallons

Water Rate as of January 1, 2027......\$1.20/1,000 gallons

Classification No. 1A – Rates are hereby established as follows:

Rates for water used by Corporations or other entities located outside the District (out of District rate)

Water Rate as of January 1, 2023.....\$2.00/1,000 gallons

Water Rate as of January 1, 2025.....\$2.20/1,000 gallons

Water Rate as of January 1, 2027......\$2.40/1,000 gallons or such other rate that shall be determined by contract between the Niagara County Water District and Corporations or other entities.
