### RENEWAL OF ELIMINATION OF NIAGARA COUNTY TAX FOR CITY OF LOCKPORT WATER SUPPLY LINE

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport raw water intake is in North Tonawanda, and

WHEREAS, the raw water line intake travels from North Tonawanda through the municipalities of Pendleton, Wheatfield, Town of Lockport and North Tonawanda for a total of 13 miles to get to the City of Lockport Summit Street filtration plant, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport prior to June 17, 2007, paid Niagara County property tax based upon the assessment of the raw water line which resulted in a water bill increase for each homeowner in the City of Lockport, and

WHEREAS, a 100% tax exemption for the City of Lockport from the Niagara County taxes on the above described 13 mile raw water line resulted in a tax levy impact of less than one cent per thousand of assessed property values, and

WHEREAS, the County passed resolution IL-046-08 on June 17, 2008 granting a tax exemption for a period of five years upon the condition that the savings be deposited into a fund designed for and used to repair or replace damaged Lockport City owned water lines thereby providing lower water bill costs to the City of Lockport residents who are residents of the County of Niagara as well, and

WHEREAS, the County passed Resolution IL-045-18 extending the exemption for an additional five (5) years until March 1, 2024, and

WHEREAS, the County passed Resolution IL-014-24 extending the exemption an additional one (1) year until March 1, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport and the County of Niagara desire to renew said exemption for another three years, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport set up an account to deposit said savings for repairs and improvements, and the Department of Utilities prepared and submitted a plan each year to the Mayor and Common Council for expenditure in accordance with the above, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County Attorney be directed to prepare the proper documents between the City of Lockport and the County of Niagara to finalize a 100% county tax exemption arrangement on the above described water intake line for an additional three years, until March 1, 2028.

Districts will take lead in contracting with Mindly Co., now known as Navi, a Tier 1 wellness program for students ages 8 and up. Navi provides evidence based, single-session, mental wellness supports to students in their critical moments of need, including skills development, action plans, and in the moment solutions to everyday problems. Navi integrates school and local crisis resources and expands service availability, and

WHEREAS, this resource will address the need for students to have more immediate access to supports in-the-moment of need, assist in reducing social stigma and uncertainty around the process of help-seeking therefore increasing help-seeking behavior, and increase students' knowledge and skill sets to make a positive impact on their lives to abate the opioid epidemic, now, therefore, be it

# A RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE USE OF LICENSED FUNERAL DIRECTORS OR FUNERAL HOMES FOR BODY REMOVAL AND TRANSPORT BY NIAGARA COUNTY CORONERS

WHEREAS, the dignity and respect of deceased individuals and their families are of utmost importance to Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, the removal and transportation of deceased individuals require professionalism, proper care, and compliance with New York State laws and regulations, and

WHEREAS, licensed funeral directors and funeral homes have the expertise, training, and proper equipment to ensure that all body removal and transport services are performed in a safe, respectful, and professional manner, and

WHEREAS, utilizing licensed funeral directors or funeral homes for body removal services reduces potential liability and ensures adherence to state standards governing the handling and transportation of deceased individuals, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature established in resolution CSS-024-16 that there would be reimbursement for the transportation of deceased individuals in the amount of \$250 per removal, such amount shall remain unchanged, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County shall hereinafter pay only licensed funeral directors or funeral homes that contract with Niagara County, upon providing proper proof of licensing and insurance, to provide such removal and transportation of deceased individuals, such removal and transportation contracts shall be renewed on an annual basis, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County legislature hereby encourages the Niagara County Coroners to utilize such contracted removal and transportation servicers to assist them in their duties as Niagara County Coroners, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the following procedure shall be utilized for the removal and transportation of deceased individuals which shall receive the \$250 reimbursement fee from Niagara County:

### 1. Requirement for Licensed Transport Services

All reimbursed body removal and transport services conducted within Niagara County shall be performed by a licensed funeral director or a funeral home licensed by the State of New York, that has contracted with Niagara County.

### 2. Compliance with State Law

All body removal and transport must comply with applicable New York State laws, including but not limited to public health, safety, and transportation requirements.

### 3. Coordination with Funeral Directors/Funeral Homes

The Niagara County Coroner's Office shall establish a list of approved licensed funeral directors or funeral homes qualified to perform body removal and transportation services, that have so contracted with Niagara County.

### 4. Effective Date

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and implementation by the Niagara County Legislature.

### 5. Notification and Communication

The Niagara County Coroner's Office shall communicate this resolution to all current coroners, law enforcement agencies, and other relevant parties to ensure compliance.

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Coroners shall provide the Niagara County Coroner's Office with verification of the name and identity of any deceased individual for whom supplies obtained from the Niagara County Coroner's Office were utilized. In the event that such verification is not provided to the Niagara County Coroner's Office within seven [7] days of the use of such supplies, then no further supplies will be provided without such verification, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution is adopted in the interest of public health, safety, and the respectful handling of deceased individuals within Niagara County.

BYWAY NOMINATION AND CORRIDOR MANAGEMENT PLAN ADOPTION

WHEREAS, the historic qualities of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, as described in the corridor management plan, and the surrounding areas have been appreciated and celebrated for over a century by the residents of New York State, as well as tourists, historians, artists, authors, and other visitors to the region; and it is this unique combination of the journeys of Harriet Tubman and those Freedom Seekers who traveled on the Underground Railroad that create the special sense of place that is vital in telling the New York story of the human desire for freedom and the historic sites they utilized during their journey to emancipation, and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, composed of representatives of 22 municipalities along the proposed scenic byway route, committed to working cooperatively to protect and promote the historic, scenic, recreational, and economic well-being of the 544mile Corridor throughout the state and agreed to pursue the nomination of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Steering Committee, each of the 22 counties contributed to the development of this corridor management plan by encouraging public participation, confirming the vision and goals, and leading individual meetings of the Collaborative, and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway, consisting of relatives of Harriet Tubman, descendants of Freedom Seekers, Harriet Tubman and/or Underground Railroad historians, representatives from state and federal agencies, has strengthened the historic integrity, representation, and the principles of the corridor management plan, and

WHEREAS, in the process of developing this corridor management plan, the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway Steering Committee has strengthened the bonds of inter-municipal cooperation, and the involved entities envision further benefit through scenic byway designation including sustained collaborative progress, increased funding opportunities for recommendations identified in the plan, enhanced partnerships with agencies responsible for the stewardship of resources along and adjacent to the byway route, and an improved visitor experience that interprets and promotes the corridor's intrinsic qualities and resources, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County of Niagara supports the designation of the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway which includes programs for stewardship and enhancement of the historic scenic byway and guidance to manage future activities along its corridor, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County of Niagara will work in partnership with the other municipalities along the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad New York Scenic Byway and local and regional stakeholders in order to support future Byway programs, economic development, marketing, and collaborate with these interested entities to explore opportunities for cooperation to realize the Scenic Byway goals.
