The number of sexually exploited children, in addition to data surrounding the correlation between abuse and mental health concerns, highlighted the need for a model shift from criminalizing to protecting victims, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature approved in Resolution CSS-057-23 to compensate Prime Care Medical of New York Inc and the PCs in the amount of \$153,000 for administration and management of the facility's MAT program for 2023, now, therefore, be it
