# RESOLUTION CALLING UPON GOVERNMENT-OWNED WESTERN REGION OTB/BATAVIA DOWNS CASINO TO RETURN \$3.2 MILLION IN FUNDS INTENDED FOR SMALL BUSINESS

WHEREAS, Investigative Post reported on May 6 that Western Region OTB and the Batavia Downs Casino, which are currently closed, took \$3.2 million from the federal Payroll Protection Program, which is administered by the Small Business Administration, and

WHEREAS, this program was intended to aid small, privately owned businesses, and not publicly-traded corporations and government-owned entities, and

WHEREAS, according to Investigative Post, Western Region OTB CEO Henry "Wojtaszek, who has doubled his salary since joining OTB nine years ago as general counsel, will be among the beneficiaries. So will his three senior managers, who took a 50 percent pay cut April 16, and some 450 full and part-time employees, most of whom were furloughed without pay at the same time. Meanwhile, Wojtaszek and his chief fiscal officer have continued to receive full pay", and

WHEREAS, various media outlets indicate that the SBA's PPP program ran out of money in just 13 days, with many small businesses unable to secure loans before the program was out of funding, and

WHEREAS, according to the May 8 Milwaukee Business Journal, the average PPP loan was \$74,304.17—meaning Western Region OTB received the equivalent of 43 average-sized loans that could have been awarded to small, family-owned businesses, and used this to offset the \$191,938 salary paid to Wojtaszek, even though WROTB had \$3.1 million in the bank, and

WHEREAS, Wojtaszek's \$191,938 salary exceeds the SBA program's \$100,000 cap, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature has always repeatedly endorsed a preference for private sector investment and development over tax dollars flowing to government-run agencies, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature calls upon Western Region OTB to return the \$3.2 million grant it received so this money can be used to support the small businesses intended, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature, as an owner of Western Region OTB, calls upon Mr. Wojtaszek to demonstrate leadership and empathy and apply the same salary cuts to himself that he applied to WROTB employees, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature calls upon Congress to close any loopholes that might allow further government-owned entities like WROTB to take funding that was intended to support our small, family-owned businesses.
