## NIAGARA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE BUDGET MODIFICATION AND AWARD OF ROOF TOP UNIT INSTALLATION BID

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office is obligated to provide heat to all persons in custody of the Niagara County Sheriff, and

WHEREAS, the Boilers in Building One of the Niagara County Jail have broken, which provide heat for part of the jail, forensic lab, criminal investigation, road patrol and other divisions, and

WHEREAS, the boilers must be fixed immediately to ensure that the Sheriff's Office is in compliance with the heating mandate, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office, with the contracted assistance of LiRo Engineering, has prepared specifications and the Niagara County Purchasing Department has advertised for bids for the Bid EPN 2111 NCCF RTU Replacement, and

WHEREAS, the following bids were publicly opened and read by our Engineering Department as tabulated below:

WHEREAS, there are funds available in Capital Project H728 Sheriff Boiler Replace Building #1 which needs to be supplemented, and

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT TO AN ACTION RELATING TO THE OPIOID CRISIS (J&J)

WHEREAS, there is pending a matter on behalf of the County of Niagara regarding the opioid addiction crisis, in which the County of Niagara is a named plaintiff in the action (the "Action"), and

WHEREAS, the Action is against several defendants, including manufacturers of opioids, distributors of opioids and chain pharmacies, and

WHEREAS, the Action alleges several causes of action against defendants Johnson & Johnson, Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc., Ortho-McNeil-Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc. and Janssen Pharmaceutica, Inc. ("J & J") based on claims that J & J contributed to the opioid epidemic by falsely promoting prescription opioids it manufactured and sold and by falsely promoting the increased use of opioids directly and generally through various "front groups" and failing to implement measures to prevent diversion of prescription opioids in connection with distribution of its products, all of which contributed to a public health crisis in the County of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, J & J has offered to settle the claims of the County of Niagara against it by paying the sum of between approximately \$851,450.62 and 41,987,094.45 over ten (10) years to be used for restitution and abatement and agreeing to not manufacture, sell or promote opioids, and

WHEREAS, the County of Niagara has approved a settlement agreement and release ("Agreement"), and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County of Niagara to resolve this matter with respect to J & J without further litigation and enter into the proposed Agreement as it shall settle all allegations against J & J and avoid protracted litigation, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the execution and delivery on behalf of and in the name of the County of Niagara by the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature, Rebecca J. Wydysh, or her designee, of the proposed Agreement is hereby authorized, and the County of Niagara by the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature, Rebecca J. Wydysh, or her designee, is hereby authorized, subject to the approval of the County Attorney, Claude A. Joerg, and directed to execute the proposed Agreement in a form substantially similar thereto and execute such other documents as may be necessary and appropriate to effectuate the settlement with J & J, and be it further

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## RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT TO AN ACTION RELATING TO THE OPIOID CRISIS (MCKESSON, CARDINAL HEALTH, AMERISOURCE, ET AL)

WHEREAS, there is pending the matter on behalf of the County of Niagara, regarding the opioid addiction crisis, in which the County of Niagara is the named plaintiff in the action (the "Action"); and

WHEREAS, the Action is against several defendants, including manufacturers of opioids, distributors of opioids and chain pharmacies, and

WHEREAS, the Action alleges several causes of action against defendants McKesson Corporation, Cardinal Health, Inc., Amerisource Bergen Drug Corporation, PSS World Medical, Inc., Kinray, LLC, Bellco Drug Corporation, and American Medical Distributors, Inc. (the "Distributors") based on claims that the Distributors contributed to the opioid epidemic by failing to comply with their obligations under the federal Controlled Substances Act and the New York Controlled Substances Act to implement adequate measures to prevent diversion of the prescription opioids they distributed to pharmacies and others in Suffolk County, all of which contributed to a public health crisis in Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, the Distributors have offered to settle the claims of Niagara County against them over eighteen (18) years and agreeing to implement injunctive relief under a controlled substance monitoring program, and

WHEREAS, the County of Niagara has approved a settlement agreement and release ("Agreement"), and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County of Niagara to resolve this matter with respect to the Distributors without further litigation and enter into the proposed Agreement as it shall settle all allegations against the Distributors and avoid protracted litigation, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the execution and delivery on behalf of and in the name of the County of Niagara by the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature, Rebecca J. Wydysh, or her designee, of the proposed Agreement is hereby authorized, and the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature, Rebecca J. Wydysh, or her designee, is hereby authorized, subject to the approval of the Niagara County Attorney, Claude A. Joerg, and directed to execute the proposed Agreement in a form substantially similar thereto and execute such other documents as may be necessary and appropriate to effectuate the settlement with the Distributors; and be it further
