A LOCAL LAW INCREASING THE MAXIUMUM ALTERNATIVE VETERAN'S EXEMPTION

WHEREAS, Legislators Irene Myers, Rebecca Wydysh, Randy Bradt, Anthony Nemi, Christopher Voccio, Jesse Gooch, Richard Andres, David Godfrey, Richard Abbott, Shawn Foti, Michael Hill and Christopher McKimmie present in writing the following proposed Local Law:

A Local Law of the County of Niagara, New York, for the year 2024, in relation to the Alternative Veteran's Exemption from Real Property Taxation under Section 458-a of the Real Property Tax Law (RPTL) of the State of New York, and

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the County of Niagara, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purpose of this law is to increase the maximum exemption allowable in Real Property Tax Law, Section 458-a(2) a, b, and c to \$30,000, \$20,000 and \$100,000 respectively.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing with the Secretary of State

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature shall conduct a public hearing upon said proposed Local Law at the Legislative Chambers, Niagara County Courthouse, Lockport, New York, on the 15th day of October, 2024 at 5:50 p.m., and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature, at least six (6) days in advance of such hearing, shall post a notice upon the bulletin boards in the Courthouse in Lockport, the Civic Building in Niagara Falls shall publish such notice once in the Union Sun & Journal, and the Niagara Gazette; such notice shall contain the title of the Local Law and an abstract of the text to be prepared by the Clerk of the Legislature, with the assistance of the County Attorney's Office
