#### NIAGARA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE FIREARMS CONSULTING AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office has been notified of the resignation of the Firearms Examiner for the Niagara County Sheriff's Office Forensic Laboratory, and

WHEREAS, there is a critical shortage of qualified firearms examiners in New York State creating firearms case backlogs to increase throughout the state, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office will be posting for a new Forensic Lab employee for Firearms Examinations, and

WHEREAS, the training period for an individual to become a qualified firearms examiner is an extensive 2 year process requiring limited training resources outside the county, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office will have a continued need for qualified firearms examinations to be performed for cases, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office has a contract with the former Firearms Examiner (Mark Shaw) who has been working as an independent contractor strictly for the purpose of required verifications and technical reviews, and

WHEREAS, Mark Shaw has agreed to continue as an independent contractor and perform forensic firearms examinations until such time as a qualified replacement can be found, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office now needs to enter into an additional agreement for an independent contractor to perform required firearms verifications and technical reviews, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office wishes to enter into an agreement with Cody McKellar for a one year period, and

WHEREAS, the firearms examinations consultations will be paid for out of the Sheriff's Office existing budget line, and

WHEREAS, the Consulting Agreement will be drawn up by the County Attorney, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature has determined that the services to be provided by the consultant requires a high degree of specialized skill constituting "professional services" and hereby waives any requirement that additional proposals must be obtained and solicited, and be it further

### NIAGARA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE BUDGET MODIFICATION – JAIL OVERTIME

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Correctional Facility (NCCF) has been greatly affected by the presence of the COVID virus in the community and in the jail, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Jail has revised their operating procedures to include quarantine of incoming incarcerated individuals for 14 days before introduction to the general population, isolation of incarcerated individuals who are ready to transfer to State Prison, and isolation of any incarcerated individuals who test COVID positive, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Jail's population count has significantly increased from 2020, including United States Marshals Federal prisoners and incarcerated individuals who are ready to transport to a State prison but the prisons are not accepting transfers due to COVID in their facility, and

WHEREAS, the COVID prevention and mitigation measures listed above have spread out the jail population which creates more open housing units and more posts to be filled with Correction Officers, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Jail staffing levels have been greatly affected during the year by COVID related illnesses as well as other long term leaves of absence, and

WHEREAS, the combination of increased posts needed and decreased staff, it has been necessary to utilize overtime in order to cover the minimum required staffing levels, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Jail receives revenue from the US Marshals for housing federal inmates, from housing State Ready incarcerated individuals and

WHEREAS the County has received stimulus funds to offset COVID related costs in correctional facilities from March 3<sup>rd</sup> through July 31<sup>st</sup>, and

WHEREAS, after 8 months of these revenue sources, the Sheriff's Office has excess revenue and would like to use this revenue to offset necessary overtime and fringe expenses in the NCCF, and

WHEREAS, the 2021 budget will need to be modified to allow for these funds to be used, now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, Niagara County Department of Management & Budget, Division of Purchasing, solicited open bidding for Transportation, by Bus or Van, of Preschool and Early Intervention Children with Disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health under Bid Number 2017-01 with said sealed bids to be received, publicly opened, read aloud, and made available for public inspection in the Purchasing Office on April 6, 2017, at 2:00 P.M., and

WHEREAS, Student Transport Inc. DBA WNY Bus Company (hereinafter referred to as "WNY"), was determined to be the lowest responsible bidder for said Transportation, by Bus or Van, of Preschool and Early Intervention Children with Disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health under Bid Number 2017-01, and was accordingly awarded the contract for Transportation, by Bus or Van, of Preschool and Early Intervention Children with Disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health under Bid Number 2017-01, and

WHEREAS, County Of Niagara (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY"), and WNY entered into a Contract on September 1, 2017 for WNY to provide transportation, by bus or van, of preschool and early intervention children with disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health for the term of September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2020, with extensions of said term to be effectuated in accordance with Appendix A to the Bid Specifications stated in Bid Number 2017-01 with said Bid Specifications, including all attachments, appendices, amendments, and modifications thereto incorporated in their entirety into said September 1, 2017 Contract and made a part thereof by reference in paragraph 2. of said September 1, 2017 Contract, and

WHEREAS, said September 1, 2017 Contract was extended by County's election for the Term of September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021, and for the term of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022, with said elections and extensions being duly agreed upon by WNY, and

WHEREAS, Appendix A, I. SCOPE, paragraph G of the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01 states: "At the commencement of each year of the contract after the first contract year (i.e. effective as of September 1, 2018) and effective on the first day of each subsequent year of the contract (including the first day or each option year, if any) the sums to be paid to the Contractor shall be increased by an amount equal to the lesser of three and one-half (3 ½) percent, or the increase in the cost of living index ("CPI") as calculated by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (as shown on the internet at www.bls.gov, and listed under All Urban Consumers for the area of "Northeast Urban"." The CPI shall be the annual CPI immediately

preceding the date on which the new contract year is to commence (e.g. the CPI increase, if any, for the period September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019 shall be based on the annual CPI for the year 2017), and

WHEREAS, WNY is bound and obligated to comply with all the terms of said September 1, 2017 Contract and the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01, including those stated Appendix A, I. SCOPE, paragraph G for the instant extension of said Contract, namely September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Igor Yuzbashev, General Manager of WNY, transmitted a letter via email to Niagara County Department of Health, c/o Victoria Pearson, Deputy Director of Financial Operations, stating, in pertinent part, WNY is seeking a rate increase of 3.2% for the Contract extension term of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022, and not the 1.3% rate increase as established by the 2020 CPI and mandated by September 1, 2017 Contract and the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01, specifically those stated Appendix A, I. SCOPE, paragraph G, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Igor Yuzbashev, General Manager of WNY, further stated, in substance, in his August 12, 2021 email letter, that should County not agree to increase the rate payable to WNY to 3.2% for the term of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022, then County should perhaps consider rebidding transportation, by bus or van, of preschool and early intervention children with disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health originally bid under Bid Number 2017-01, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Attorney's Office advised the Niagara County Department of Health and the County Manager for Niagara County that WNY and County had a fully valid and enforceable contract, namely said September 1, 2017 Contract and the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01, which WNY is legally bound to perform all of its obligations contained in said Contract and Bid Specifications, and if WNY refuses to perform and abide by all said valid and enforceable terms of said Contract and Bid Specifications, then County should terminate said September 1, 2017 Contract in accordance with paragraph 17 of said Contract in writing, within ten (10) days, for WNY's failure to comply with the terms of said Contract and Bid Specifications and for County to rebid such contract, and

WHEREAS, NCDOH began, along with the assistance of Niagara County Department of Management & Budget, Division of Purchasing, to expedite a new bidding process for Transportation, by Bus or Van, of Preschool and Early Intervention Children with Disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health, and

WHEREAS, NCDOH was apprised and informed from various sources that there is currently a shortage of bus drivers in Niagara County, and in fact statewide, and thus it would be impracticable, and essentially impossible, to rebid the Transportation, by Bus or Van, of Preschool and Early Intervention Children with Disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health and potentially secure another bus transportation service for the children of County in time for the commencement of the 2021 – 2022 school year which is approximately two (2) weeks away, and

WHEREAS, County is mandated by the State of New York to provide transportation, by bus or van, of preschool and early intervention children with disabilities, and the failure of County to provide such transportation would be a breach of its state-mandated obligation, and more importantly, would deprive the children of County necessary transportation to their respective schools, and

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, particularly the facts stated in the instant paragraph above, COUNTY now faces a public emergency arising out of unforeseen occurrences or conditions (i.e., WNY's refusal to abide by the terms of said September 1, 2017 Contract and the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01) which is resulting in County being prohibited from providing New York State mandated transportation to the children of County and therefore depriving the children of the County necessary transportation to their respective schools and whereby said circumstances are affecting the life, health or safety of inhabitants of the County and require immediate action which cannot await competitive bidding, and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature has declared such public emergency, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by at least a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the whole Legislature, this Legislature has determined it is impracticable to advertise bids to provide transportation, by bus or van, of preschool and early intervention children with disabilities for Niagara County Department of Health, and be it further

RESOLVED, County and WNY are hereby authorized following the County Attorney's review to enter into a written amendment to the said September 1, 2017 Contract and the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01, specifically Appendix A, I. SCOPE, paragraph G, to state the rate increase County shall pay WNY for the term of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022 be set at 3.2%, with all the other terms of said September 1, 2017 Contract and the Bid Specifications contained in Bid Number 2017-01 to remain unamended and in full force and effect, with such rate increase to commence after the passing of this Resolution, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature shall conduct a public hearing on the 19th day of October, 2021 at 5:45 p.m. for public and municipal input upon termination of the annual thirty (30) day period within which a land owner may submit a request for inclusion, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall publish the following notice in the Lockport Union Sun and Journal, and the Niagara Gazette, as well as, post such notice on the home page of the County's website, and such notice shall give in writing directly to those municipalities whose territory encompasses the lands which are proposed to be included in an agricultural district.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Niagara County Legislature will conduct a public hearing on the day of October 19, 2021 at 5:45 p.m. in the Legislative Chambers, Courthouse, Lockport, New York, for the purpose of hearing public comments on the inclusion of predominantly viable agricultural land within agricultural district #7. Two (2) parcels have been proposed for inclusion. The Niagara County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board recommends the inclusion of the following parcels of predominantly viable agricultural land into the Agricultural District: Parcel 80.03-2-72, consisting of 34.675 acres, located on Stone Road in the Town of Lockport. Parcel 14.00-1-15.21, consisting of 26.80 acres, located on Lake Road in the Town of Newfane. # RESOLUTION FOR FUNDING NIAGARA COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE WELDING AND METAL WORKING LAB INVESTMENT

WHEREAS, the County of Niagara, and Niagara County Community College acknowledge and embrace the need to provide an educational environment so that investments can be made in the skilled trades, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County Community College is prepared to provide degree and non-degree programmatic learning opportunities, these include but are not limited to degrees such as Welding Technology AAS, Mechanical Technology/Mechanical Design AAS, and Industrial Process Technology AAS. Furthermore, let it be known that this investment will propel and expand the college's ability to continue its mission of providing technical educational to our community, and

WHEREAS, to meet this need, Niagara County Community College, will construct a state-of-the-art welding and metal working laboratory environment to include, but not limited to the following elements:

- Installation of equipment provided through a National Science Foundation Grant in the amount of \$300,000. Items such as new welding stations, plasma cutting table, and metal working machines are already on site and ready for installation.
- Installation of significant electrical distribution systems for above listed equipment.
- Installation of HVAC and exhaust systems to provide proper ventilation of gases and normal cooling and heating.
- Piped welding gases for safety and student use vs cylinder type distribution.
- Life Safety system, basic renovations (painting, signage, etc.) to support the functions of the lab.

The lab will be housed in the C-Annex building, utilizing vacant and construction-ready space totaling approximately 4,000 square feet, and

# SUPPORT FOR THE RIVIERA THEATRE AND ORGAN PRESERVATION SOCIETY RIVIERA THEATRE EXPANSION PROJECT PHASE 3

WHEREAS, the Niagara Power Coalition ("NPC") and the New York Power Authority agreed to a licensing settlement for the next 50 years for the Niagara Power Project, and

WHEREAS, that settlement allows Niagara County to receive, through NPC Host Community Standing Committee ("HCSC"), up to \$390,000 annually to fund projects which are found to be consistent with the Niagara Greenway projects along the Greenway Trail, and

WHEREAS, the Riviera Theatre and Organ Preservation Society, Inc. has made application to the Niagara County's Ad Hoc Committee on Recreation and Tourism for Greenway funds to support Phase 2 and Phase 3 of the Riviera Theatre Expansion Project, and

WHEREAS, Phase 2 of the Riviera Theatre Expansion Project consisted of the acquisition of adjacent property at 71 Webster Street, North Tonawanda, which Riviera Theatre has now closed on the purchase, and

WHEREAS, Phase 3 of the Riviera Theatre Expansion Project includes a conceptual design and operational study of the newly acquired 6,195 square foot building for the purposes of converting the existing space into modern patron amenities, including accessible modern restrooms, a concession and bar area, along with updated dressing rooms for the performers, together with the renovation of the 6,195 square foot building, which will give the Riviera Theatre a greater downtown footprint and street front presence, and allow for new accessible restroom facilities as well as a larger and more accessible lobby area to improve the general patron experience as well as provide accessibility for people of all ages and mobility levels, and

WHEREAS, Phase 3 of the Riviera Theatre Expansion Project will allow the Riviera Theatre to increase the variety and scope of cultural programs offered, which will generate revenue, increase the comfort of patrons, generate foot traffic along the Erie Canal and in the City of North Tonawanda and increase the visibility of the Niagara River Greenway as a cultural and arts destination, and

WHEREAS, the Riviera Theatre Expansion Project will cause a positive economic impact in the City of North Tonawanda and County and enhance the visitor experience, and

WHEREAS, the application is requesting \$175,000.00 to be utilized, along with previous efforts, for a total project cost of over two million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the Riviera Theatre has already completed the purchase of 71 Webster Street to expand the theatre with needed space and modernization of its facilities and is looking for \$175,000.00 to be used strictly for development stage of Phase 3 with \$120,000.00 to be immediately available for engineering and architectural construction documents, and

WHEREAS, the Riviera Theatre Expansion Project Phase 3 has the support and approval of Legislators Richard Andres, Jesse P. Gooch, Randy R. Bradt, City of North Tonawanda Mayor Arthur G. Pappas and Lumber City Development Corporation, and

WHEREAS, the Ad Hoc Committee for Recreation and Tourism Fund appointed by the Niagara County Legislature to review projects brought to Niagara County seeking funding from Niagara County through the Niagara Power Coalition and the Host Community Standing Committee; has recommended that Niagara County approve and support this project, and

WHEREAS, the Riviera Theatre and Organ Preservation Society has utilized great effort and is complimented for seeking and obtaining additional funds to lower their actual request for funds; and

WHEREAS, after receipt of in-kind services and primary financing and grant support from other sources, \$175,000.00 is being requested, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature does hereby support and sponsor the funding of \$175,000.00 for the Riviera Theatre and Organ Preservation Society Phase 3 of Riviera Theatre Expansion Project when presented to the Niagara Power Coalition and the Host Community Standing Committee.
