Niagara County should not wait for New York State to act and should implement legislation to discourage and prevent cyber-bullying from occurring.

Therefore, the purpose of this law is to ban cyber-bullying in Niagara County.

Section 2. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms to have the meanings indicated:

- A. County the County of Niagara, New York.
- B. Cyber-bullying shall mean engaging in a course of conduct or repeatedly committing acts of abusive behavior over a period of time by communicating or causing a communication to be sent by mechanical or electronic means, posting statements on the internet or through a computer network. Acts of abusive behavior shall include, but not be limited to, taunting; threatening; intimidating; insulting; tormenting; humiliating; disseminating embarrassing or sexually explicit photographs, either actual or modified, of a minor; disseminating the private, personal or sexual information, either factual or false, of a minor; or sending hate mail.
 - C. Minor shall mean any natural person or individual under the age of eighteen (18).
- D. Person shall mean any natural person, individual, corporation, unincorporated association, proprietorship, firm, partnership, joint venture, joint-stock association, or other entity or business organization of any kind.

Section 3. Prohibitions.

No person shall engage in cyber-bullying against any minor or person in the County of Niagara.

Section 4. Penalties.

Any person who knowingly violates the provisions of this local law shall be guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 and/or up to one year imprisonment.

Section 5. Applicability.

This law shall apply to all actions occurring on or after the effective date of this law.

Section 6. Reverse Preemption.

This law shall be null and void on the day that statewide or federal legislation goes into effect, incorporating either the same or substantially similar provisions as are contained in this local law or in the event that a pertinent state or federal administrative agency issues and promulgates regulations preempting such action by the County of Niagara. The County Legislature may determine via mere resolution whether or not identical or substantially similar statewide legislation has been enacted for the purposes of triggering the provisions of this section.

Section 7. Effective Date.

This local law shall become effective immediately upon the filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 8. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or the application thereof, to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional such order of judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.
