NIAGARA COUNTY TREASURER'S OFFICE SOLE SOURCE STANDARDIZATION OF ANNUAL SYSTEM MAINTENANCE AND HOSTING OF TAX COLLECTION SOFTWARE SYSTEM TO SYSTEMS EAST, INC.

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Treasurer's Office has utilized a very customized Tax Collection Software System from Systems East, Inc. (TCS) since 2003, and

WHEREAS, Systems East, Inc. hosts the software rather than it being hosted on client's servers, which increases the ease with which they can provide upgrades and support, and

WHEREAS, there is an annual maintenance for hosting and the annual maintenance for 2025 is \$38,079.00, and

WHEREAS, Systems East, Inc. is the sole source for hosting and annual maintenance of its own software system, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that for reasons of efficiency and economy, pursuant to General Municipal Law 103(5), there is a need for standardization for the Niagara County Treasurer's Office in the purchase of annual service maintenance and hosting for the Systems East, Inc. TCS Tax Collection Software system, and be it further

RESOLVED, that it is hereby determined that Systems East, Inc., is the sole source vendor for the annual service maintenance and hosting for the TCS Tax Collection Software system, and that the Niagara County Treasurer's Office is hereby authorized to purchase the annual service maintenance and hosting for the TCS Tax Collection Software system directly from Systems East, Inc., without the need to solicit for alternate proposals, such purchase to be made in consultation with Purchasing Department and in accordance with budgetary procedures.

AUTHORIZATION TO CONVEY CERTAIN TAX SALE PROPERTY (PROPERTY COMMONLY KNOWN AS D'ANGELO DRIVE) TO THE TOWN OF WHEATFIELD

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Treasurer, acting in his capacity as Tax Enforcing Officer, acquired title to tax sale property commonly known as D'Angelo Drive, in the Town of Wheatfield, New York assessed as SBL# 176.05-1-28 pursuant to the Niagara County in rem tax foreclosure proceeding filed in the Niagara County Clerk's Office under Index No.: 138861 (the "Property"), and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wheatfield, a municipal subdivision of the State of New York, has notified the County of Niagara of its desire to own the property, as stated in the Town Board resolution on the 18th day of November 2024, and in consideration of said transfer, has also represented and warranted that said parcel is landlocked with the Town of Wheatfield owning an adjacent parcel on one side and a retention pond being on the other, and the Town needing access to the retention pond for maintenance, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wheatfield already possesses an easement over said parcel for the access, and

WHEREAS, conveyance of the Property by the County of Niagara to the Town of Wheatfield is in the best interests of both the County of Niagara and the Town of Wheatfield in that it will ensure the maintenance and safety of the retention pond which is adjacent to a number of residences, and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions under which the property is to be conveyed to the Town of Wheatfield are subject to the final review and approval by the Niagara County Attorney's Office and the attorney of the Town of Wheatfield but must include legally binding assurances of the Town of Wheatfield holding harmless and fully indemnifying the County of Niagara from any liability, damage, claims or judgments arising from the condition and use of the Property including the condition and use of the Property thereafter by the Town of Wheatfield, its transferees, grantees, successors and assigns, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, Pursuant to §215 (8) of the County Law, and Real Property Tax Law 1166 the Niagara County Legislature hereby authorizes the County of Niagara to convey tax sale property commonly known as D'Angelo Drive, located in the Town of Wheatfield, New York, to the Town of Wheatfield, and is hereby authorized and directed to sign and deliver a deed, along with any and all other necessary title transfer documents to the Town of Wheatfield, subject to review by the Niagara County Attorney.

WHEREAS, the City of North Tonawanda has instituted In Rem actions under Niagara County Supreme Court Index #E184008/2024 for the foreclosure of certain tax liens for the years 2014 and subsequent against various parcels of land situate within the City of North Tonawanda, New York, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Laws of the City of North Tonawanda as an opt-out municipality of Article 11 of the Real Property Tax Law, and

WHEREAS, tax districts having an interest in various parcels may enter into an agreement making provisions for conveyance of said parcels without public sale, and upon such terms as said districts may agree upon between themselves, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have conferred and negotiated as to the method of handling the various parcels included in said action, and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to memorialize their agreement with the execution of an Inter-Municipal Cooperation Agreement, a copy of which is incorporated by reference, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an inter-municipal cooperation agreements with the City of North Tonawanda regarding the City of North Tonawanda In Rem action filed with the Niagara County Supreme Court under Index #E184008/2024.
