WHEREAS, in order to protect the public interest and the welfare of the employees in the payment of prevailing wages and benefits, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and necessary to provide safeguards and adopt certain procedures to insure compliance with the provisions of Section 220 of the State Labor Law, and

WHEREAS, it is valuable for local government to encourage broad participation in such New York State Certified Worker Training Programs by the residents of Niagara County and to foster the equal opportunity of men and women of all races and backgrounds to participate in order to enhance workforce development and diversification, and to prevent exclusionary practices which have historically excluded women and minorities; these safeguards are in the best interests of the taxpayer and the citizens of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Labor sets objective standards and provides oversight for New York State Certified Worker Training Programs; these Programs are important because they require on-the-job training and classroom training, and provide objective industry standards; in effect these programs lead to a standardized, cost effective and skilled labor workforce, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that any contractors desiring to bid on any Niagara County Construction project wherein the successful bid is in excess of one million and 00/100 dollars [\$1,000,000.00], must show proof to the proper agency of the County that the employees of the contractor are covered by an approved health and hospital insurance plan, an approved pension plan and an apprentice training program, pursuant to standards approved by the "New York State Apprentice Program."

Section 1. Short Title.

This Local Law shall be known as "The Niagara County Workforce Development and Diversification New York State Certified Worker Training Program."

Section 2. Definitions.

- A. "New York State Certified Worker Training Program" Shall mean: a state registered and regulated apprenticeship program through the New York State Department of Labor that has been approved by the New York State Commissioner of Labor in accordance with Article 23 of the New York Labor Law, that includes the following standards:
 - (i) An organized, written plan in place that embodies the terms and conditions of employment, and training and supervision of one or more workers;

- (ii) A schedule of wages to be paid to the worker consistent with the skills required and approved by the New York State Department of Labor;
- B. "Commissioner" shall mean the Commissioner of the Niagara County Department of Public Works.
- C. Construction contract" shall mean projects with a value in excess of one million and 00/100 dollars [\$1,000,000.00], where Niagara County is a direct party to the contract which includes an incidental amount of construction type activity intended to benefit the public, including all work which is necessary, incidental or connected with the execution of the contract which is performed by construction workers. A construction contract includes: projects that Niagara County funds directly, projects that Niagara County funds indirectly by providing funds to a separate entity to perform the construction type activity and construction projects built under Niagara County's direction and later paid for with Niagara County funds except for construction contracts wherein Niagara County is partnered with other counties.
- D. "Construction subcontract" shall mean any subcontract between a contractor who has a construction contract as defined in Section 3, subdivision C above.
- E. "Contractor" or "subcontractor" shall mean a contractor or subcontractor that directly employs construction workers, as defined below, under a construction contract or construction subcontract, as defined herein, for which a New York Certified Worker Training Program is required.
- F. "Construction worker" shall mean an individual directly involved in the construction, reconstruction, improvement, rehabilitation, installation, alteration, renovation, demolition or otherwise providing for any building, facility, roads, highways, bridges, or physical structure of any kind, but does not include professional services employees or those construction workers for which a New York State certified Worker Training Program does not exist.

Section 3. Requirements.

A. Any contractor, prior to entering into a construction contract set forth in section 3. (C.) above, or any subcontractor entering into a construction subcontract with a contractor who has a construction contract with the County of Niagara is required to have in place and provide written proof of same at the time of bid a New York State Certified Worker Training Program, either internally to the contractor or subcontractor and/or through an organization servicing several contractors or subcontractors, appropriate the type and scope of work to be performed.

Section 4. Penalties.

Violation of any provision of this Local Law shall constitute cause, grounds or other legal justification for Niagara County to refuse to award the construction contract to the lowest bid and/or the termination of any contractual agreement with any contractor or subcontractor engaged in a construction contract or construction subcontract with the County, in accordance with County and state law, rules and regulations governing the termination of such contractual agreements.

Section 5, Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or the application thereof, to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance, shall be adjudged by

any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 6. Applicability.

This Local Law shall apply to construction contracts advertised for bids on or after the effective date.

Section 7. Effective Dates.

This Local Law shall take effect 30 days after the filing with the Secretary of State, in accordance with Section 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature shall conduct a public hearing upon such proposed Local Law at the Legislative Chambers, Courthouse, Lockport, New York, on the 5th day of December 2023, at 5:50 p.m., and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature, at least six (6) days in advance of such hearing, shall post a notice upon the bulletin boards in the Courthouse in Lockport, the Civic Building in Niagara Falls shall publish such notice once in the Union Sun & Journal, and the Niagara Gazette; such notice shall contain the title of the Local Law and an abstract of the text to be prepared by the Clerk of the Legislature, with the assistance of the County Attorney's Office

RATIFICATION OF MODIFIED AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF NIAGARA AND LOCAL 182 AMERICAN FEDERATION OF STATE, COUNTY & MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES AFFILIATED WITH NEW YORK COUNCIL 66, AFL-CIO

WHEREAS, the County of Niagara, and Local 182 American Federation of State, County & Municipal Employees Affiliated with New York Council 66, AFL-CIO (AFSCME Union) reached a collective bargaining agreement for the period of September 13, 2022 through December 31, 2025 which was approved by the Niagara County Legislature on September 13, 2022 (CW-018-22), and

WHEREAS, the County of Niagara, and the Local 182 American Federation of State, County & Municipal Employees Affiliated with New York Council 66, AFL-CIO (AFSCME Union) have reached a Tentative Agreement ("the Agreement") to modify said collective bargaining agreement, and

WHEREAS, said modified Agreement was ratified by the AFSCME Union on November 8, 2023, and

WHEREAS, funds are available in the 2024 budgeted appropriations and fund balance to carry out the fiscal obligations in the Agreement, and

WHEREAS, prior to the execution of the Agreement, the County Attorney will review the agreement for approval as to legal form, language, and compliance, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that upon a vote and approval of the County Legislature on December 5, 2023, the Agreement will be approved as the final ratified Agreement between the parties for the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Article 17, be modified as follows: the 2023 AFSCME wage schedule rates shall increase by \$1.50 per hour followed by 2.75% general wage increase effective 1/1/2024; 2.75% general wage increase effective 1/1/2025; 2.5% general wage increase effective 1/1/2026, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Article 17, Section 3, New Positions, be modified pursuant to the Tentative Agreement, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Article 17, Section 17, Working Higher Position, be modified pursuant to the Tentative Agreement, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Article 18, Section 5, CDL License Expense Reimbursement, be added pursuant to the Tentative Agreement, and be it further

RESOLVED, that all other contract terms and conditions will remain in full force and effect, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Manager is authorized to direct the Departments of Human Resources, Risk Management, Budget, and the Treasurer's Office to implement and administer the provisions of the Agreement, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature be, and hereby is authorized to execute said Agreement on behalf of the County of Niagara, subject to the approval of the County Attorney.
