NCE&T Mike K	There have been 9 OJT's for February. Among these were: 3 at Vishay, 2 at Shannon Global Energy Solutions and 1 at J.W. Burke in Akron. Mike outlined some collaboration on the creation of OJT's including a referral from Orleans-Niagara B.O.C.E.S. and working with the refugee resettlement program at Jewish Family Services.

Policy and Advocacy: Attended Town Hall meeting with US Legislators. Registered Apprenticeships (RAs): Met with 1 WDB Director who helped to create a new RA, 1 former mfg alliance employee, 1 company that created a new RA in the past year. Exploring ways to improve the pipeline for new RAs in our area. Meeting with MACNY soon. Buffalo Niagara Manufacturing Alliance: Met with Peter Ahrens in person. He seems very pro-active and is eager to serve Niagara County businesses. Provided him with EMSI data for CNC machine shops in Niagara; he is collaborating with NCCC to create trainings. Business Outreach: Met via Zoom with Niacet to assist with recruiting. Niacet has a new management team. Met in person with One Hemp Holistics; they are creating a new LLC as a cannabis company. Offered assistance and referrals to services for hemp company. Don Jablonski will contact Mike Casale to discuss further outreach. 90% OJT Reimbursements Extended: The grant for 90% OJTs for youth ages 18-24 in Niagara County has been extended until 2023. One-Stop Center Renovations: The Career Center renovations have begun! Wallpaper is being removed and fresh coat of paint. Also new

NCCED Mike C	Twenty companies have been contacted under Retention including contact with Precious Plate, Niagara Envelope and Olin Corp. Business Workshop is March 2 Agri-Business Outreach Forum- April 8, 9a-3p In response to the need to develop more sites for development, the Niagara County Legislature has approved the creation of new industrial park on Junction Rd. in Cambria. The IDA sponsored COVID related relief fund for businesses was a huge hit and available funds were quickly exhausted. A resolution was approved earlier this month that approved the issuance by the IDA's Niagara Development Corp for up to \$90M of tax exempt and/or taxable multi-modal revenue bonds for Catholic Health for the hospital project in Lockport and upgrades to Mt. St. Mary's in Lewiston.
