1. OSSO report JBM reviewed Stats for this quarter WIOA Youth

• Numbers are intentionally lower due to reduction in counselors. There is intensive work tied to managing caseloads

CRT (Classroom Training)

• On par to last year; have successfully spent all training money;

OJT (On the Job Training)

• There are 12 new on the job trainings in three months at ten different companies. This is a substantial accomplishment. Kudos to Niagara County Employment and Training. Clearly, they are doing a great job!

Don's updates: Career Fair in Oppenheim Park, very successful; 357 job seekers came through as an estimate but it was likely closer to 450; employers have multiple candidates to consider; most successful of all career fairs;





About budgets:

- Job Corp likely to be permanently closed;
- WIOA budget cut by 11% across the board; The team has been able to find other budgets for carry in money so they are able to retain staff without a problem. Funding for programs for Youth are fully funded by the state. WIOA budget is a second cut go around and this effects adult and dislocated workers; Operating on first come first serve basis due to limitations of numbers they can be served;
- Working on alternative grant resources;
- Lobbying state to make them whole to come up with necessary funding;

- Planning a Youth career exploration fair that focuses on youth with disabilities at ON-BOCES; This will provide hands on demonstrations of different careers and occupational areas to determine their possibilities. Skilled trades, auto mechanics etc.
