#### I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Joel Feuerman at 8:14 a.m. at the Niagara County Department of Economic Development, 6311 Inducon Corporate Drive, Sanborn, NY. Joel Feuerman noted that a quorum was not present. [Note: Construction traffic delayed road access.]

#### **II.Old Business**

No Quorum –unable to approve minutes for Dec 10, 2014, Feb 11, 2015, and May 14, 2015.

#### **III.** New Business

#### A. Opening/Member Update

Welcoming, all attendees did 30 second introductions (name and representation, and briefly what their company/agency does).

# **B.** Transfer DW to Adult

It has been determined that a transfer of \$57,000 is appropriate to meet Adult training and Dislocated Worker spending goals.

The item of Business will be to transfer \$57,000 of DW funds to Adult funding for training.

Mr. See said the transfer of funds was approved at last year's meeting, June 2014.

Mr. Jaccarino asked for a **brief definition** of Dislocated Worker for the WIB members who were not familiar with DW terminology.

It was said, an Adult is 18 years of age or order, and the Dislocated Worker is one that is laid off. Funding allocation comes from Federal, State then Local. Funding: DW is usually 10 - 15% higher in allocation than Adult. We need more for Adult funding, need to transfer Dislocated Worker funds to increase training for Adults.

# C. Youth Program Awards

Information was provided as a basis for the new Regulations for youth under WIOA. The Board will determine agencies awarded and funding amounts.

Received RFP Youth proposals from the following:

- Niagara County Employment & Training Department
- Niagara Falls City School District
- Orleans Niagara BOCES-Niagara County Community College-YWCA

# Total \$630,000

WIB members will vote on award of funding via email according to the procedure approved in the By-Laws (due to lack of quorum).

# **D.** Open – Member Discussion & News

Mr. See said the Executive Summary shows what responding providers are going to do and what the costs are. Reviewers looked at the proposals individually and came up with ranking and comments, which were discussed with the Executive Committee.

Mr. Casale said the Executive Committee is a formal process for review and the WIB Board will look at the recommendations and vote via email (due to lack of quorum) according to the bylaws. He also mentioned that we need more private sector review.

Mr. Feuerman said we should respect the work that the team does. He mentioned the importance of being thankful to the newest members of the review team.

Ms. Palys mentioned the importance of having reviewers that understand the law.

The WIB discussed partial funding and Ms. Palys said it would be determined by the Board.
